






## Delivery of the Defence Industrial Capability Plan

**Defence Industry and Innovation** 



### **Project Objectives**

Through focused research, analysis and consultation, this project seeks to:

- Establish an industrial baseline of defence industry capabilities;
- Develop the Sovereign Industrial Capability Assessment Framework (SICAF);
- Describe and identify Australia's SICs; and
- Produce the Defence Industrial Capability Plan (DICP), providing direction for Australian industry over the next 10 years, in particular where organisations may look to invest and grow.


But this is only the beginning. The needs of Defence and the capabilities of industry will continue to evolve over time, and we need to stay abreast of this. The tools, processes and policies established over the coming months will provide the foundation for future iterations of this work and development of industry policy for years to come.

**Methodology:** How will we approach this significant body of work?

Critical to the success of the project will be regular, targeted and meaningful consultation with key stakeholders throughout the project including various Australian Government departments and agencies, state and territory governments, the Department of Defence, Defence industry, academia, industry bodies and research organisations.



### Frequently Asked Questions




#### The Defence Industry Policy Statement (DIPS) describes industrial capabilities in the Defence context as

"any information or knowledge; technology or technology application; invention or innovation; platform, system or equipment; profession, skill or discipline; that can be provided by Australian industry in full to enable the ADF to deliver a military effect or for Defence to achieve a Defence capability outcome"



## The DIPS describes SICs as those industrial capabilities

"that are so important to Australian Defence missions that they must be developed or supported by Australian industry because overseas sources do not provide the required security or assurances we need. As such, it is critical that the industry base associated with these capabilities is maintained and supported by Defence as sovereign industrial capabilities."



It is anticipated that the development of the SICAF, and preparation of the DICP, would directly guide Defence's investments and interventions in the market. Defence will take a deep interest in identified SICs and, when considered necessary, deliver a range of measures to support.

Complementary to the Australian Industry Capability (AIC) Program, where companies are encouraged to grow local industry and domestic supply chains as part of a major contract, it is also anticipated that an SIC will be 'pulled forward' by Defence outside of any direct commercial need to ensure it is accessible and capable when the ADF requires it. Exactly how Defence deals with companies that are involved in SICs will be shaped through analysis and consultation, and will be described in the DICP.



# Through the survey, we are seeking to develop a national industrial capability baseline.

One version of the survey focuses on the demand of the Department of Defence, and will be completed by Defence employees ranging from Capability Managers through to Program Managers, Enablers and System Program Offices. A separate version of the survey focuses on the supply capabilities of Australia's Defence industry, and will be completed by representatives from the Primes, Small-to-Medium Enterprises (SMEs), academia and research organisations.

Your input is vital if we are to develop recommendations and action based on accurate data. Without considered input from Defence and Defence industry we risk developing a set of SIC that do not accurately reflect Defence's needs or the capabilities of Australian industry.
